
## **LAPD – Langley Area Pickleball Dinkers**

The photo above was taken on one of our typical Pickleball play days at Douglas Park in the summer of 2018.

Most of us live in or near Langley City and are members at the Timms Community Center. As representatives of the local Pickleball community (70 & growing quickly), we are requesting that work be done to <u>fix surface cracks and re-paint</u> <u>Douglas Park's outdoor court surfaces</u>. Douglas Park's courts are currently painted only for tennis. One of them is temporarily lined for Pickleball with tape and we regularly have 16 Pickleball players playing on that single tennis court, with more waiting their turn. The other single tennis court only occasionally sees 2 players on it (often, it is four more Pickleball players). This photo shows a single tennis court that has been re-painted as 4 Pickleball courts.



In January of this year, the Sports & Fitness Industry Association announced that Pickleball continues to be one of the fastest growing sports in North America and there are now over 3.2 million players, with 6,885 places to play and over 21,000 Pickleball courts.



For these reasons, we request that one of the 2 Douglas Park tennis courts be re-painted as four dedicated Pickleball courts, with the other tennis court also marked with tape to allow 4 more.

Karlo Tamondong at the Douglas Recreation Centre office has reserved the tennis courts and sports box for us at Douglas Park to host a **Pickleball tournament in Langley on July 5, 6 & 7**. We're opening up this three-day tournament to several hundred players and we will work with local Tourism, Chamber and Downtown Langley Business Association people whenever possible to help boost business for local business owners. This tournament is being sanctioned by Pickleball Canada and net proceeds will be donated to **Douglas Park Community School** to support the work they do for the kids who attend there.

An application has already been made to Langley City to fund the purchase of additional Pickleball nets, balls and line marking tape for our upcoming tournament, and, of course, they will be used going forward by our rapidly growing Pickleball family playing here in Langley City.
