
Are you experiencing chronic addiction?

Our community provides men, regardless of their financial background, an accessible, year-long, residential program.

Successful applicants are given a unique opportunity to regain their physical, emotional and spiritual well-being, and remove barriers to their long-term health.

Our structured and strict program combines work roles, education, clinical therapy and healthcare support as a platform to empower men to reclaim their lives.

OUR COMMUNITY

The Baldy Hughes community is located on 166 acres of beautiful woodland property that includes a farm, greenhouse, school, gym, auditorium, garage, store, residential facilities, and more.

Residents and staff work alongside one another to help operate and develop the community. In addition to daily recovery programming, residents experience long and active days, and perform tasks ranging from farm and mechanical work, to landscaping and indoor jobs.

Residents at Baldy Hughes participate in social and recreational activities of their choice. They can also finish high school on site and participate in skills training courses.

To qualify for admission, applicants must be ready, willing and able to commit to the one year program and participate in all aspects of community life and programming. In addition, applicants must:

- Be a male of legal age in B.C. – 19 yrs
- Not on any Benzodiazepine medications or prescription narcotics
- Not be on a Methadone protocol
- Have funding approved before entry

Baldy Hughes Therapeutic Community & Farm operates under the auspices of BC New Hope Recovery Society – a non-profit charitable organization.
