TOPIC: Start Me Up BC campaign - installation of 1000 publicly accessible Automated External Defibrillators in our communities

ACTION YOU WISH COUNCIL TO TAKE: The "Why" & "Solution" behind the Start Me Up BC campaign, it addresses the serious gap in our public emergency preparedness platform - making AED's more accessible to BC residents and visitors. We launched the program in spring (2021), and SJA is pleased to announce that 14 stands have been installed. The goal of the program is to place 1,000 publicly accessible Automated External Defibrillators in stands across British Columbia, along with the launch of a lifesaving companion app. We are looking for financial support from your community to purchase and install these stands in outdoor public spaces.
