PURPOSE:

The purpose of the report is to seek Council’s support for the distribution of the community grants.

COMMENTS/ANALYSIS:

The City has allocated \$168,000 to provide community grants to organizations that contribute to the general interest and advantage of the City.

Upon further clarification, the Dutch Liberation Canadian Society has withdrawn the community grant application because they were unable to source tulips due to the flooding experienced in the Fraser Valley.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

The grants requested for the first intake with an application deadline of December 15, 2021, totalled \$141,458.19 from 27 organizations of which \$113,058.19 was identified for distribution.

ALTERNATIVES:

Council could alter the amounts of the grants being considered and/or approve other grant requests.
