Be it resolved that Council directs staff to report to Council with draft bylaw and agreement amendments for Council to consider animal control services be potentially provided directly by the Township of Langley Bylaw Department, considering:

1. a commitment to the Langley Animal Protection Society for it to continue to provide animal shelter services exclusive to Township of Langley residents and taxpayers;
2. improved service levels for residents with deceased pets or deceased lost or stray animals; and
3. an expansion of the current spay and neuter program, exclusive to Township of Langley residents.

That staff report to Council with draft bylaw amendments for Council to consider streamlining, multi-year options and improvements to dog licensing, and further

That staff report to Council with a review of the capital improvements, renewal or additions that may be necessary within 10-15 years to ensure quality and sufficient animal control and sheltering service levels are maintained as the Township of Langley continues to grow.
